Avoiding a Water Damaged Basement

Before spring returns, you should make sure your basement won't flood as snow and ice melt. There are several things to look for when inspecting your basement for potential spots where flooding could occur: proper placement and condition of gutters and downspouts, a foundation free of cracks, a working sump pump, a clean septic and sewer system and window covers for below grade windows. Call One Stop Home Repair to ensure your basement is ready for spring.

The goal of gutters is to draw storm water at least 3 feet away from your home. In order to do that, the gutters have to be clear of debris and downspouts have to be directed away from the house and long enough to direct water accordingly. If necessary, your can get extensions and/or troughs to prevent water from traveling where it shouldn't.

Foundation cracks are the perfect invitation for water, especially when snow melts and water can't escape as it sits beneath the snow. The only direction that it can go is toward the cracks in your basement. Minor cracks can be sealed with epoxy and masonry sealer. If a crack is more serious you should give us a call immediately.

Your sump pump should be free of debris and connected to a reliable power source. If your power goes out frequently, a generator would be a wise investment.

Any below grade basement windows would benefit from window well covers to ensure that rain and melt water can't get inside. You can choose durable, clear covers that allow natural light into the basement.
